## How to Use Materials

1. Let your Cub Scout Parent's Orientation Guide be your primary guide to answer questions. Your "Tiger Cub Handbook" will be helpful as well. If you get a question you can't answer, commit to getting the answer by the next meeting, then call on your Cubmaster.
2. Tiger Cub Handbooks should be purchased in advance of School Night. That way you can sell them to parents that night and get them off to a great start.
3. Help us tell the story of Tiger Cubs in your neighborhood, identify the first graders and their parents, then invite them to join. You, as Tiger Cub Organizer, are the neighborhood "expert". Please help us tell the story of Tiger Cubs.
4. Thank you for making time to be a Tiger Cub Organizer. Please prepare to ensure that this first night of Scouting for these new members is a good one. Yours is a key role in the "School Night To Join Scouting" program and your efforts will help launch this GRRR-EAT PROGRAM for new Tiger Cubs and their families.

	✓ Be sure to cover the following points:	
	A. Tiger Cubs is a one-on-one program for boys and adult partners.	
	B. Each Tiger Cub Den has a Tiger Cub Den leader who helps coordinates the den meetings. However, the Tiger Cub Den operates with shared leadership. Each boy/adult team hosts one or two meetings during the year. (Recruit a Tiger Cub Den Leader if necessary)	
	C. Tiger Cubs is a family program with monthly group activities. These activities will be based on the advancement plan found in the Tiger Cub Handbook. (Show the Tiger Cub Handbook and explain the advancement and totem/beads concept.)	
	D. The Tiger Cub Den is part of a pack, and attends all pack functions and activities. The Tiger Cubs will graduate into Cub Scouting at the end of their Tiger Cub year.	
	II. Answer Any Questions	
	III. Registration	
	✓ During this part of the program, the Tiger Cub Organizer should circulate among the group(s) that will be affiliated with their pack to distribute application forms, help set dates, assist with completion and collection of applications, and fees.	
	A. Distribute one Application to join a Pack form to each boy/adult team for completion.	
	B. Explain the cost of registration. Include information about Boys' Life magazine. If you are including pack fees, be sure to include them. Please	

be mindful of boys who may need financial assistance. Please do not turn anyone away because of financial concerns.

- C. Distribute one Tiger Cub Handbook (if pre-purchased) to each boy/adult team joining.
- D. Collect completed forms and fees.
- E. Have each team fill in the den roster located in the New Den Leader Kit.
- F. Have each den determine the date, time location, and host team for their first gathering. Make sure that their first meeting is scheduled within two weeks.

#### IV. Closing

- A. Remind everyone of the dates that have been set for their first gatherings and when and where the next pack meeting will be.
- B. Thank them for coming and wish them a great Tiger Cub experience.

#### V. After The Meeting

  - C. Give applications, fees and remaining handbooks (if pre-purchased) to the Cubmaster to take to the designated School Night turn-in location.
  - D. Rearrange the room as it was before the rally.
